how?

Selected students and teachers will be trained as SMART Rangers by the officers of Global Environment Centre, Alam Flora and the local authority in the area.

Using a training module, students will be taught the importance, benefits and the art of recycling and composting through a series of talks by the officers.

To further enhance understanding of the recycling and composting methods, demonstration will be included in the module



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RRECYCLE! is a waste management component of the SMART Ranger Programme. It is a recycling programme for schools which focuses on educating and promoting environment awareness not only to school children, but adult as well.

In return, SMART Rangers should be able to train their fellow students in managing their resources and help to minimise as much waste as possible, at the same time generating an income for the school/club/classroom.

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Why be a River Ranger?

a river management programme



objectives



Global Environment Centre, a non-profit environmental NGO, has initiated a River Ranger Programme under the SMART Ranger Programme which aims to create awareness and educate schools and students on river issues and the importance of managing our rivers. In return, it is hoped that students will get a better understanding of the river systems and care and appreciate the value of a river.

how river ranger programme works?

20 teachers and students will be selected and trained by the officers of Global Environment Centre according to the Programme's module on how to be a River Ranger. Using a training module, they will cover topics on river and river issues, river basin problems, integrated river basin management and "hands-on" training. In hands-on training, the rangers will be taken to the river and carry out water quality testing using physical, chemical and biological monitoring using living animals in the river.

Upon completing the modules, they will be given a certificate of recognition and they will be a fully certified River Ranger to carry out river monitoring in their area.

The River Ranger Programme website has been created under the SMART Ranger website where these rangers can put up their findings on the web to be shared with other interested parties.
